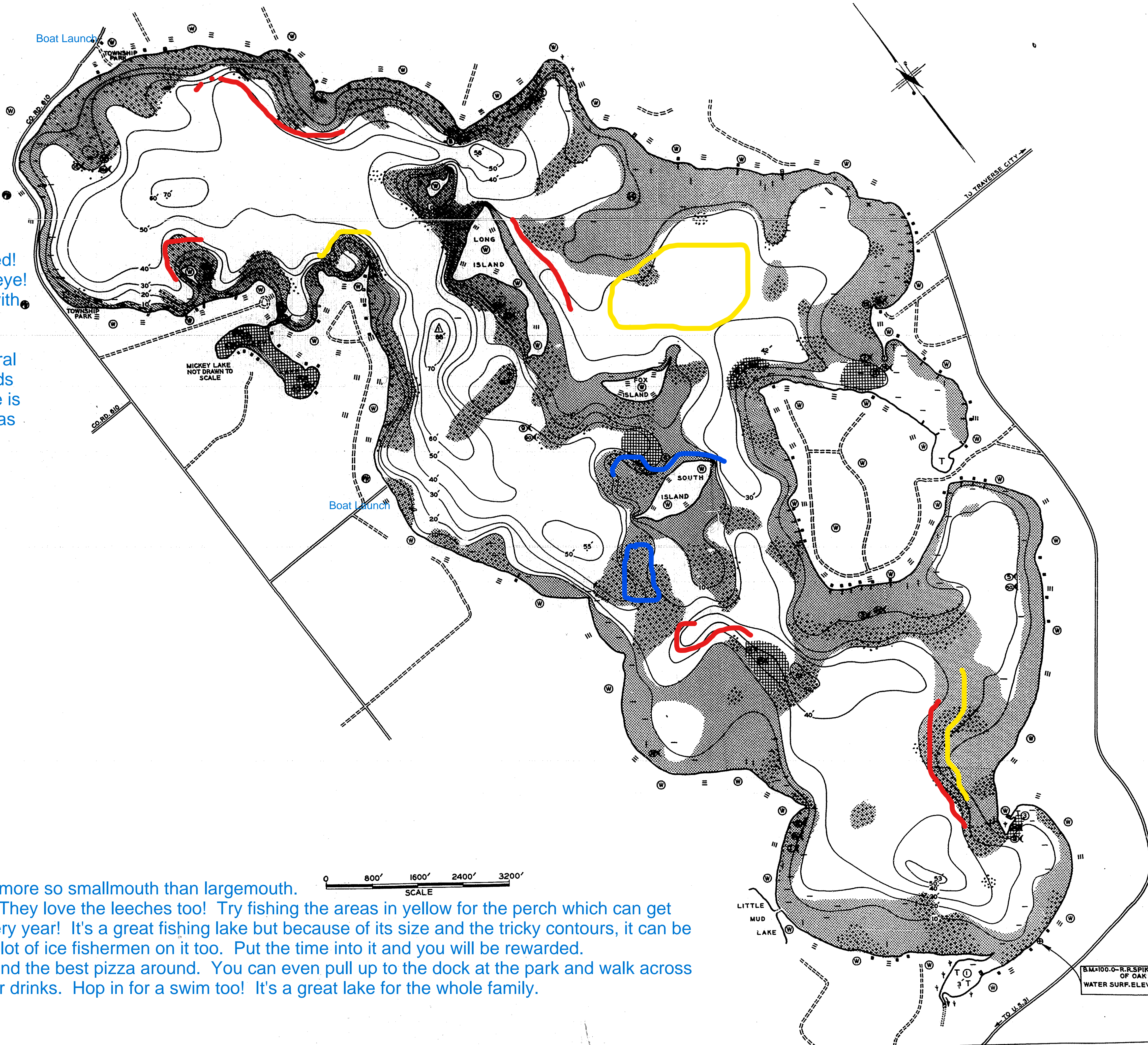

Long Lake is huge and can be tricky. It's a very popular lake and the boat launches can get packed! There is a good self-sustaining population of walleye! In the summer, it's relatively easy to catch them with leeches under a slip bobber. Set your knot so the leech is just off the bottom. This works best right before dark. On any given day, you will see several anglers trolling for walleyes too. Use planer boards to get your lines far away from the boat. This lake is very clear and the eyes are boat shy. Try the areas in red for a start.

There is also great smallmouth bass fishing and more so smallmouth than largemouth. Try the areas in blue with standard bass tackle. They love the leeches too! Try fishing the areas in yellow for the perch which can get massive! Perch over two pounds are caught every year! It's a great fishing lake but because of its size and the tricky contours, it can be quite frustrating at times. Long Lake also gets a lot of ice fishermen on it too. Put the time into it and you will be rewarded. Be sure to stop into Long Lake Grocery for bait and the best pizza around. You can even pull up to the dock at the park and walk across the street so that's convenient if you need food or drinks. Hop in for a swim too! It's a great lake for the whole family.
